Other Grants & Financial Assistance

Utility Grants Scheme:

Relief grants for paying overdue energy or water bills are available to low-income Victorians experiencing unexpected hardship. Grants include \$650 on each utility type in a two-year period (or \$1,300 for households with a single source of energy (for example, electricity only).

Access: Phone your electricity, gas or water retailer to request an application. Your retailer will ask you some preliminary questions before starting your application. The application can be completed online, or your retailer will post you a paper form to complete. A friend, support worker or financial counsellor can help you complete the application.

Eligibility: Must have Pensioner, Healthcare or Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be a low income household.

Private Rental Assistant Program and PRAP Plus

Provides people at risk of, or experiencing homelessness with financial and practical assistance to establish and maintain private rental tenancies. It helps people to find or keep a home by assisting them with information about the rental market, the housing search process, and offers practical support (e.g. rental applications). Eligible clients may receive funding to help cover the cost of rent in advance and other tenancy establishment costs or rent arrears.

the Queens Fund

Provides grants of up to \$350 to single women or single women and their children who have lived in Victoria for at least 12 months who are experiencing hardship. Grants can be used for rent, relocation, education, utilities etc. Can also apply for assistance with prescription glasses, refurbished computers and Telstra Vouchers. Applications are assessed on a monthly basis and can only be received once per year.

Access: Applications must be made through a case worker/social worker from agencies including Diamond Valley Community Support.
